Rory's tips on creating your own outdoor kitchen

1. Plan Your Space Wisely

Think carefully about where your outdoor kitchen will go. Consider sunlight, wind direction, privacy from neighbours, and proximity to your home. Make sure there's enough room for cooking, dining, and relaxing comfortably.

Rory's top tips

- Don't put your cooking zone too near garden gates or paths where kids or pets run
- Check your garden at different times of day; a spot that's shady at lunch may be in full sun by dinner!
- Including space for pots of herbs or edible plants can enhance the outdoor cooking experience with fresh, home-grown ingredients.

2. Pick Materials and Furniture That Suit Your Style and Budget

Select materials that can withstand the elements while complementing your garden's style. Pressure-treated timber, reclaimed brick, or stone are all solid choices. Don't be afraid to mix materials for character - as long as they're built to last outdoors!

Rory's top tips

- Combine tough surfaces like heat-proof granite or concrete around the grill and softer timber or recycled composites in seating zones to give contrast.
- Choose tiles or pavers that are suitable for outdoor use and have a textured, non-slip finish if you're near a sink - especially important if you have kids or pets.
- Opt for B&Q's outdoor kitchen range - as all the furniture is modular, it makes it easy to mix and match depending on your style and garden layout.

3. Build a Solid, Functional Structure

A strong foundation is essential. Whether you opt for a timber frame, brick construction or something ready-made, ensure it is level, secure, and suitable for the weight of your appliances. Use proper fixings and outdoor-rated finishes to extend its lifespan.

Rory's top tips

- Opt for stainless steel bolts and brackets, which won't rust and stain your timber or stonework.
- Avoid putting heavy BBQs over drain covers or utility access panels, as you may need access someday.

4. Choose the Right Cooking Equipment

Tailor the cooking zone to suit lifestyle and space. A quality hybrid barbecue or pizza oven covers most needs, but for those who entertain often, consider adding a sink, prep area, or even a fridge. Always use certified outdoor appliances and plan plumbing and electrics from the start. If using gas, it's also worth checking out [B&Q's Flo-Gas services](#) to ensure everything is set up safely and correctly.

Rory's top tips

- Know how to work your BBQ, larger grills will give you the opportunity to grill, bake and roast!
- Look at dual-fuel BBQs (gas/charcoal) so you can switch up your cooking style without needing extra gear.
- Keep your BBQ well away from doors and windows, ensure good airflow (avoid enclosed or tucked-away spots), use the correct gas, and always turn it off properly.

5. Add the Finishing Touches

This is where functionality meets flair. Add lighting for ambience and visibility, weatherproof furniture for lounging, and soft furnishings like rugs and cushions to blend the space into your garden. A canopy or pergola with a retractable roof also helps make the area usable in all seasons, allows the choice between sun and shade.

Rory's top tips



- Pick cushions, rugs and throws that are made for the outdoors so they dry quickly and withstand the weather.
- If you add a pergola or canopy, leave at least 1m clearance above heat sources to allow cooking smoke to escape.
